Objectives of the module:	<p>The student will develop speaking, listening, reading and writing skills and achieve a A1.2 level of Polish language according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages, CEFR.</p> <p>The student will develop:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - <i>communication language competence</i> including receptive, productive and interactive activities. - <i>linguistic competence</i>, which are skills to apply language knowledge such as grammar, vocabulary, spelling and pronunciation. - <i>social-linguistic competence</i>, which is the knowledge of social and cultural background in language communication - a <i>specific knowledge about Polish realities</i> that facilitate a functioning in Polish society

Teaching methods:	<p>group work under the guidance of a teacher</p> <p>work in pairs alone or under the guidance of a teacher</p> <p>individual work alone or under the guidance of a teacher</p> <p>Forms of work depend on the type of task carried out by learners: during the presentation the student works with the whole group, oral or written exercises can be performed alone in pairs or small groups.</p>

Assessment methods:	<p>At the end of the semester the final assessment consists of 2 parts: written test and oral exam 65+15 = 80 points.</p> <p>Written test: multiple-choice and fill-in test and open questions test, 65 questions, 1 point/question, minimum 60% 0-38 – failed, 39-44 – satisfactory, 45-50 – satisfactory +, 51-55 – good, 56-60 – very good, 61-65 – excellent</p> <p>Oral exam: 5 questions randomly selected or asked by the teacher, 3 points each questions, minimum 60% 0-8 – failed, 9 – satisfactory, 10 – satisfactory +, 11 – good, 12-13 – very good, 14-15 – excellent</p> <p>The final grade is an average arithmetic of 2 parts.</p>		

	No extra assessment methods are anticipated. In case of unforeseen, unusual circumstances mandatory remote teaching and remote assessment methods might be adopted.
